Academy Award Nominated Short Films 2005

This R-rated program comprises eight short films nominated for Academy Awards® ... these are the best of the best from 2005!

Best Live-action Short Film:

- ~ **"Little Terrorist"** is about a lad caught in a minefield between India and Pakistan who's saved by the schoolmaster. From India.
- ~ **"At 7:35 in the Morning"** is a quirky song and dance made to seem more amateur than it is. From Spain.
- ~ **"Two Cars, One Night"** covers a chance meeting between a 9-year-old boy, already posturing, and a 12-year-old girl, already knowing. From New Zealand.
- ~ **"Wasp"** is the story of a poor white woman, burdened with more children than money, who just wants a bit of fun. Her life is symbolized by the wasp that scrambles against the glass window until she lets it out. From United Kingdom.

Best Animated Short Film:

- ~ **"Gopher Broke"** is funny and ironic. Standing by the side of a road and working on ways to get a bit of lunch, this gopher gets much more than it bargains for. From US.
- ~ **"Birthday Boy"** is about a Korean boy who plays with his tanks and points his finger like a gun. He finds a box on his front porch that holds sad news, but he's too young to figure it out. From Australia.
- ~ **"Ryan"** is the story of Ryan Larkin, an animator whose star burned out in the late Sixties. It is creepy while beautiful and brilliant in its use of color and non-color, and in telling this man's story. From Canada.
- ~ **"Rex Steel: Nazi Smasher"** is a delightful variation on the Flash Gordon genre, complete with a Nazi whose volubious badoongs continue vibrating long after the rest of her stops. From US.
